Jean Cutler is currently the Director of the Bureau for Historic Preservation at the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission where she manages the Commonwealth's historic preservation programs. Previous to this, Ms. Cutler had a broad range of employment with arts and historical organizations and government agencies. She served as the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Federation of Museums and Historical Organization; Program Director of the Hershey Museum; Executive Director of the Doshi Center for Contemporary Art; Public Information Officer for the Sun Inn Preservation Association; and art history instructor at the Pennsylvania State University, Mt. Alto Campus.

She spent almost 10 year employed in federal government service, including assignment as assistant editor for the Central Intelligence Agency and as a Bi-lingual Research Intelligence Analyst for the Defense Intelligent Agency. She had assignments in Washington, DC; Paris; France; Hong Kong, BCC; and Beirut, Lebanon.

She received her Bachelor of Arts Degree from Mary Washington College of the University of Virginia in Foreign Service and completed graduate work in Art History at the Pennsylvania State University. Throughout her career, Ms. Cutler has participated in continuing professional education programs.

Ms. Cutler is the co-founder of Covenant Community Corporation and serves as its Vice-President for Development.
